School's History & Demographics:

Built in 1962, Bartow Middle school has 56 classroom teachers, 15 resource teachers, 11 paraprofessionals and 28 other staff. The enrollment data collected in spring 2015 was 841 students. Of this total enrollment, 22% African-American, 45% white, and 29% Hispanic.
